

The Expanded Food and Nutrition Education Program (EFNEP) is making a significant impact in Forsyth County through its partnership with the Crisis Control Ministry. As part of the Crisis Control Ministry's Certified Healthy Client-Choice Pantry, EFNEP offers hands-on cooking and nutrition classes to help families develop the skills necessary to make healthier food choices on a budget.
